FOOTNOTES: 32 PARTS OF THE BODY

- 1. HEAD HAIRS in this exercise are only the scalp hair.
- 2. <u>BODY HAIRS</u> includes eyebrows, eyelashes, nose hair, ear hair, moustaches, and beards.
- 3. The human body has approximately <u>640 MUSCLE GROUPS</u>.
- 4. <u>LIGAMENTS</u> are fibrous connective tissue which attach bone to bone, holds them together, and keeps them stable.
- 5. There are <u>206 BONES</u> in adult bodies over the age of 21.
- 6. <u>FASCIA</u> is a sheathing of connective tissue that holds every organ, blood vessel, bone, nerve fiber and muscle in place.
- 7. The <u>DIGESTIVE SYSTEM</u> is the entire tract from mouth to anus & includes oesophagus, stomach, small intestine, large intestine.
- 8. <u>MESENTERY & MESOCOLONS</u> are membranes that anchor and support the small and large intestines.
- 9. <u>UNDIGESTED FOOD</u> is in the stomach and small intestine going through the digestive process of nutriment extraction.
- 10. <u>DIGESTED FOOD</u> has had the nutriments extracted and is in the large intestine.
- 11. BILE is historically described as "Oil" which has two kinds:
 - a. "local bile" is produced in the liver, stored in the gall bladder, and makes oils and fats in food bioavailable.
 - b. "free bile" /oil soaks the entire body, exudes to the outside of the skin, and spreads like a lubricant over the body with the exception of teeth, nails, and hard dry skin.
- 12. <u>PHLEGM</u> is an aqueous mucus secretion produced by the respiratory system.
- 13. <u>PUS</u> includes the pus substance itself and any damaged areas of the body that produced the pus.
- 14. <u>GREASE</u> is the oil that secretes on the surface of palms, soles of feet, nose, forehead, and shoulders.
